The purpose of the public hearing is to inform the public, and receive public testimony followed by a regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors to adopt Ordinance 2021-02 entitled: "An Ordinance of District Township, Berks County, PA relating to the storage of rubbish and waste and providing for inspections, establishing procedures for compliance and penalties for violation." At the conclusion of the public hearing, the Board will convene its regular meeting and intends to adopt this same Ordinance. A SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE NO. 2021-02

**AN ORDINANCE OF DISTRICT TOWNSHIP, BERKS
COUNTY, PA. RELATING TO THE STORAGE OF
RUBBISH AND WASTE AND PROVIDING FOR
INSPECTIONS, ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES FOR
COMPLIANCE AND PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION**

Premises. The background of the adoption of this Ordinance is stated.

- Section 2. Definitions** contains defined terms and their specific meaning(s).
- Section 3. Application** established the applicability of Ordinance provisions.
- Section 4. Property** specifies prohibited conditions of real property.
- Section 5. Nuisance** declares conditions of Ordinance violations.
- Section 6. Responsible Persons** confirms the responsibility of specified individuals and/or entities for violations.
- Section 7. Inspections and Right of Entry** confirms authority for investigation of complaints, inspection of property and enforcement of Ordinance.
- Section 8. Procedure** provides for notice, opportunity to cure violation and authority to remedy noncompliance.

Section 9. Penalties provides penalties for violations of the Ordinance.

Section 10. Authorized Officers confirms authority for enforcement by individuals.

Section 11. Joint and Several Liability confirms joint and several liability for Ordinance violations.

Section 12. Severability provides that if any Ordinance provision is declared invalid or unconstitutional, balance of Ordinance shall remain in effect.

Section 13. Repealer repeals prior inconsistent Ordinances.

Section 14. Effective Date provides Ordinance shall take effect five (5) days after adoption.
